POSSIBLE CLAIMS

Possible climate claims with Tree.ly projects

At Tree.ly, we are committed to be transparently in all our sustainability efforts to ensure the protection of your reputation. We are always available to answer any questions about our quality standards such as additionality, leakage, baselines, etc.

Do's

- We invest an annual sum of XXX in climate protection projects that offer a range of environmental benefits, including a certain amount of sequestered tons of CO₂.
- We emit XXX tons of CO₂ per year, and to this extent, we support TÜV-certified climate protection projects that promote climate resilience and forest conversion. This contributes significantly to the viability of our forests.
- We also recommend that you disclose as many details as possible about our projects. Transparent communication is the best way to avoid greenwashing and the associated loss of reputation.
- The CO2 credits we purchased have been verified and issued by TÜV.
- We support high-quality, TÜV-verified climate protection projects amounting to XXX euros, thereby contributing to global climate protection efforts.

Dont's

- The EU has now heavily regulated the following terms and further antitrust tightening will follow. Therefore, do not use the following terms: climate neutrality, CO₂-negative, climate positive, CO₂-positive.
- With Tree.ly credits, it is therefore not possible, for example, to claim 'climate neutrality'
- Also, for example, 'By supporting Tree.ly projects, we offset our CO₂ footprint.' is not allowable.
- Please be aware of 'Truth of claims', which means, for example, that the acquired 'Contribution Claims' are not 'Offsets', and must not be represented as such.
- The directive adopted in 2023 prohibits the claim of climate neutrality or emission reductions if these are achieved through the purchase of CO₂ credits (No Offsetting).
